<u>Trends on Technological changes and Qualifications</u>

This research acts as a *baseline* for the partnership, aiming to form a more relevant *connection* between VET education and EU qualifications and the current needs of the Energy and Sustainability sector (SE). This was divided into 3 phases: 1. *Documentation* of new trends on specific fields in Sustainable Energy, 2. *Research* on the impact of current trends on the needed workforce qualifications and 3. a *Synthesis report* with conclusions and recommendations for policy makers.
